- What?** ACT Senior Retake Opportunity
- Who?** All eligible students- seniors who took the State ACT in April or used an ACT voucher during their junior year.
- When?** The National (Saturday) ACT Test date on **October 22, 2016** is the only ACT Retake opportunity.
- How?** **You will receive an ACT Retake Voucher or an ACT Fee Waiver** to pay your \$42.50 ACT Registration fee. We are waiting on our shipment of vouchers and waivers and will make an announcement to let you know when they have arrived.

You can create an ACT student web account (www.actstudent.org) using the ACT ID from your score report, along with a User ID of your choice. Once you've created an account, you can also use the link below to access the log in page.

What can I do with an account?

- Register – Early Registration Deadline Friday- **September 16, 2016**
- View scores
- Send additional score reports
- Register for next test

Register for the ACT- (This needs to be done after you receive your voucher/waiver- no longer than September 16 to meet the October Early Registration Deadline.)

- About 40 Minutes - Information you provide will be visualized on your score report to help you to explore possible careers that align with your stated interests
- Desktop or laptop with an internet connection - Mobile and tablet not recommended
- ACT Voucher or ACT Fee Waiver
- High school course details (use your unofficial transcript-received August 1st)

- Headshot photo - Now or anytime before the photo deadline –October 14
Photo submission options include:
 - Uploading a photo from your computer
 - Uploading a photo using a mobile device
 - Submitting a printed photo

Requesting Accommodations

To request accommodations for an administration of the ACT, examinees must first:

Create an [ACT web account](#), or log in to an existing account register for a test date

When registering to test, examinees must determine what accommodations will meet their needs.

Refer to the comparison chart within the [Accommodations on the ACT® Test](#) to review the requirements and features of National Extended Time (50% time extension) and Special Testing (at examinee's school) to decide which is most appropriate for you.

Note: The basic fees for accommodated testing are the same.

Once an examinee has registered online for the ACT, ACT will automatically email instructions (with Subject: Requesting Accommodations on the ACT) regarding how to work with a qualified school official to request accommodations and submit supporting documentation via the Test Accessibility and Accommodations System (TAA).
